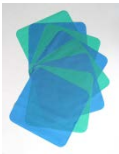

Why was this resource consolidation packet created and who is it intended for?

This manual was originally created by Skye after they started running Trans* Lafayette, a support and social group for the trans*, DSD, and intersex communities and our allies. The resource was created for these communities to put people in control of their own bodies, give them important information about legal rights and health care, and give people access to support and social groups that sex and gender diverse people may not otherwise know how to find or be able to access. Special emphasis was placed on finding resources for some of our frequently over-looked community members, especially those of lower socioeconomic class, those experiencing homelessness, those living with a disability, youth and elderly, people of color, etc. The internet has expanded so rapidly in the last ten years that finding information, health care resources, or local support can be a daunting task.

Note that there are some Midwest and Indiana-specific resources listed so that this packet can better serve the trans*, DSD, and intersex populations in that area. This packet expands as community members give input and add to the resources listed and resources from all over the U.S. are welcome!

Although the trans*, DSD, and intersex communities were the focus on this manual, there are MANY resources for the greater LGBTQ+, Same Gender Loving (SGL), and allied communities since over time our communities have become united in an effort to support all bodies, identities, and forms of love and all types of relationships.

How do I submit suggestions, corrections, or updates that I want included in this packet?

Please feel free to contact Skye Brown at skye@pridelafayette.org to submit suggestions, corrections, or information that needs to be updated. All of these forms of feedback and highly recommended and encouraged to help keep this manual updated and useful!

How frequently is this packet updated?

Resources will constantly be added as they are discovered or reported to Skye, and an updated packet will most likely be added to the Trans* Lafayette page on Pride Lafayette's website once every few months. A full review and update of the manual will be done once a year between December and January. This packet was originally released in mid-March (2013) and the version you are now reading is Version 4 and was released in October of 2013.

What is the next step?

The next step is finding health care resources for Indiana trans* community members. One of the greatest disparities trans* populations face is severely limited access to general health care, transitioning-related health care, mental health care, and health insurance. This project is already underway and is being called "Trans* Friendly and Aware Medical Practitioners in Indiana: doctors who treat trans* people with respect – a resource built by trans* and gender diverse community members." You can find this resource on Trans* Lafayette's webpage: www.pridelafayette.org/translafayette.

The ultimate goal is to create a "Pink Pages" document for the state of Indiana where the LGBTQ+ population of Indiana can immediately locate LGBTQ+ friendly services of all kinds all over the state. By the time this version gets released, the Pink Pages document will already be in progress.

There are MANY other resources Skye is developing with the support and input from trans* and allied individuals from around the state of Indiana. These include “Trans* 101” documents for trans* people as well as those important in the lives of trans* people, a document on legal name and gender marker changes, a document for those who are undocumented and trans* or trans* and living with a disability, plus many, many more. What this packet is and is not:

This packet is:

- A consolidation of some resources online and some physical resources that have a website
- An easy way to get information for and about LGBTQ+/SGL experiences, health, and resources
- A great place to begin exploring LGBTQ+/SGL experiences and identities
- An effort to fill gaps in access to resources for the trans*, DSD, and intersex communities

This packet is NOT:

- A replacement for advice and care from doctors or other medical or health professionals
- A legal document that can replace advice from lawyers and other legal professionals
- A representation of the views of Pride Lafayette, Trans* Lafayette, Skye, or anyone else who posts this manual as a resource
- A comprehensive list of resources and information for the trans* and intersex communities , those living with DSD, or the greater LGBTQ+/SGL community

What do the “M” and “Y” symbols next to certain links mean?

The large red M with “18+ ONLY” means the material next to it is for mature audiences over the age of 18 only. If you are under 18, please do not attempt to access this link. There are MANY resources throughout this manual that are specifically made for young people and they will have information that covers the same topics but approach them in a more appropriate and effective way towards youth. This is what the “Y” is for! Anything with a large yellow Y with “youth!” next to it was specifically developed for youth and is safe for youth to use. Youth is loosely defined as those 25 years old or younger in this packet, but many websites define youth differently. For all other resources that have neither of these symbols, the material has not been labeled for mature audiences or youth audiences on the website. These websites are typically expected to be safe for youth, but they were not created with youth in mind and may be less applicable to young people than those websites dedicated to young people. Note that if one of these symbols is next to a section title, it indicates the entire section is for those 18 years old or older OR all the links in that section were created for youth.

Some information about terminology, word choice, and word meaning in this packet:

This section is not an attempt to create a comprehensive look at LGBTQ+ terminology, it is only in place to help explain the cultural and historical context of some of the terminology used in this document. Hopefully, this information will make using this resource easier and more understandable. The following explanations are not comprehensive and definitely do not reflect the way everyone thinks about these words.

LGBTQ+ and SGL

LGBTQ is the acronym most often used to describe sexual and gender diverse people. LGBTQ stands for “lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans*, and queer”. The plus symbol (+) is often added after LGBTQ to acknowledge that the community is MUCH bigger than just these 5 identity labels. SGL stands for “same-gender loving” and is a term that is sometimes used by people of color to describe their attraction to people of the same gender. There is a long history for each of these terms and their social context is complicated. Use words for people that they use to describe themselves only – never assign someone a label based on how you think they identify.

Trans* vs. Trans vs. Transgender

Trans* was a term that became popular on tumblr where “trans” was short for “transgender” and the asterisk was a way for people to imply a list of transgender –inclusive identities. Since gender identities are extremely diverse and there is no comprehensive way to accurately reflect ALL gender identities with a list of labels, the asterisk is simply used to imply a fully inclusive list. Note that most frequently, “trans*” is used to describe the entire spectrum of transgender identities and therefore describes a community or group of people rather than an individual. “Trans*” can also be used to describe a “trans* individual” if the person’s specific gender identity is not otherwise described or if they identify under the trans* umbrella.

“trans” (without the asterisk) can imply either “trans*” or “transgender” depending on the person’s intent. Sometimes people choose not to type out the “*” and shorten “trans*” to “trans”, but intend “trans” to be a fully inclusive community label. Other times, people shorten “transgender” to “trans” and use it to describe the trans community or a transgender identified individual. Ultimately, any of these terms are respectful terms to use for the trans* community or a transgender identified person. Lastly, remember that labels are personal – use the words that individuals use for themselves.

Transgender vs. Transgendered

Transgender is the grammatically correct term to use when describing a transgender person, someone with a transgender identity, or the transgender community or population. Using “transgendered” in place of transgender is a common grammatical mistake both inside and outside of the trans* community. For example, saying, “Mika is a transgendered man,” suggests that Mika had transgender happen to him – which *does not* make sense. “Mika is a transgender man,” states that Mika is a man that identifies as transgender or is transgender – which *does* make sense. Note that this document only uses “transgender” but many resources listed in this packet use the term “transgendered” in place of “transgender”.

Transvestite and Hermaphrodite

Since both of these terms are used almost exclusively either as LGBTQ+ slurs or as medical terms, they are not typically taken on as chosen identity labels. Hermaphrodite has historically been used to explain a very specific (and very rare) disorder of sexual development and/or form of intersex body but is not an accurate descriptor for the majority of those with DSDs and intersex bodies and therefore is rarely used anymore. By many in the DSD and intersex communities it is considered offensive because it erases diversity in bodies and bodily experiences and has historically been used in a derogatory way, so it is recommended to never identify anyone as a hermaphrodite (unless they identify that way themselves).

Transvestite has been historically used to describe a type of diagnosable sexual fetish, transvestite fetishism. This term has also often – incorrectly and inappropriately – been used to describe working transwomen or female-presenting DSD/intersex persons. There are a lot of stigmas and stereotypes associated with “transvestite”, so it should not be used to describe a trans* person, those diagnosed with DSDs, or an intersex person. As an exception, some trans* people who are older do identify as transvestite (which is frequently shorted to “TV”). This is not “wrong”; it is simply the word they choose to use to describe their identity. However, this label (just like all labels) should NEVER be applied to someone, especially if they do not identify that way themselves.

DSD (Disorders of Sexual Development) vs. Intersex

Until 2006, anyone whose body, chromosomes, or hormones did not fit within a medically defined category of “male” or “female” at birth or later at puberty was assigned a diagnosis of “hermaphrodite” or “intersex”. For decades these terms have created stigmas against those outside the physical binary. This is why “Disorders of Sexual Development”, frequently shortened to DSD, started being used in 2006 after a paper was published on the topic (<http://pediatrics.aappublications.org/content/118/2/e488.full.pdf+html>). DSD is a medical diagnosis describing a congenital condition a person has that affects their body’s sexual development. Many people now prefer to use DSD because it suggests a condition affecting the body rather than an identity inherent to a person. In recent years there has been a push for greater understanding of the diversity of bodies that exist and a simultaneous movement for appreciating bodies of every shape and size, which has created more room for those with DSD and those in the intersex community. In part due to this movement many people – especially youth – who have been diagnosed with DSD have begun reclaiming and embracing “intersex” as an identity. Many of those who identify as intersex do not want to be diagnosed with a disorder, but prefer to be proud of their non-binary bodies. The ultimate point here is that these two terms are highly personalized and mean something different to each person. Both of these terms frequently invoke strong opinions from those within their communities.

To be respectful to those with either viewpoint, effort has been made to include both terms throughout this manual. When writing the acronym “LGBTQ”, the “I” has been removed to be respectful to those who identify as having a DSD but a “+” has been added to the end (LGBTQ+) to denote that there are many people within the broader community that are not represented by those 5 letters. Again, the creator of this manual as well as those that publicize this document are not responsible and cannot control the terminology used in the resources listed.

DSD and Intersex within the Trans* Label

There are many resources throughout this packet that are listed as trans* resources but which are also very helpful to the DSD and Intersex communities. The reason many of these resources are simply listed as “trans*” resources is because trans* people, those with DSD, and the intersex community are frequently the populations that exist in the physical and emotional middle space of an American sex binary. Although there are many differences between these groups, many of our experiences are very similar because there are similar stigmas that are carried about those who do not identify strongly with their body form, who strongly identify with other forms of body, those whose bodies are not strictly “male” or “female”, or those who seek to modify their bodies. Navigating friendships, romantic relationships, and sexual relationships can be especially challenging when binary standards of bodies are placed on those between or outside of the binary. Because of these similarities, I frequently include information for the DSD and intersex population with resources labeled for trans* people. This is never to erase identities or experiences, or suggest that any or all DSD diagnosed individuals or intersex people identify within the trans* umbrella, but simply to recognize some of the similarities in our experiences.

American vs. Western vs. Global Labels across Time

It should be noted that the labels used to describe bodies and experiences of sexuality and gender vary A LOT over time and space. Skye has created this document predominately as a resource for those within the U.S. or those with an American perspective of gender. It is unfair to gender diverse and gender non-conforming people in other cultures and living with different labels and definitions about sexuality and gender to try use the labels in this document on them. The term the “Western world” was avoided because this term is not well defined and carries a lot of cultural weight with it. To add to the complexity, labels change across time and many peoples’ identities change across time.

Conclusion: This document cannot represent any population within a single label or necessarily within a certain space, so use the document however it best helps you as an individual!

“Trans Enough” and Passing

As more people are revealing their trans* and gender non-conforming identities, there has been increasing discussion about how to defines trans* identities. Many people are asking: How is transgender defined? Is there more than one definition? What does it mean to be trans* “enough”? These questions frequently devalue identities and experiences by excluding people. If you want more information about “Trans* Enough” discussions, visit this Tumblr: <http://transenoughblog.tumblr.com/>. *Part of the purpose of this packet is to demonstrate that there is no concrete definition for trans* identities and therefore all bodies and identities are welcome!*

This discussion goes alongside other conversations around passing and presentation. Passing is a term that usually refers to someone’s identity being recognized in a specific way in a public space. This could mean being recognized as male or female, being recognized with a certain ability level, being recognized as part of a certain racial or ethnic category, etc. The idea of “passing” as anything is not only a very complicated part of gender expression and performance, but there are a lot of politics regarding passing inside and outside of trans* communities. One of the most important things to understand is that “passing” within any community **DEPENDS** upon the community. Gender norms (the behaviors, clothing, hair style, and other things that define masculinity or femininity in a society) vary between cultures and subcultures. Passing as “male” for an urban black transman is going to involve very different expectations than a rural white transman. *The problem with many websites that promote “passing tips” is that they do not take into consideration the complexity of what passing means and how passing varies between cultures and complex identities.* For this reason, please always examine websites and resources for yourself.

How to use each section of this packet:

Section 1: Trans* Affirming Health Care

“**General Health Info and Advocacy**” is a section where trans* people can get information about the standards of care health professionals are and should be held to when treating trans* people.

The “**Health Clinics**” section is organized by alphabetical order of state abbreviation. The section about “**Transition Focused Health Clinics**” is a list of clinics throughout the U.S. that offer the most comprehensive care for transsexual persons looking to modify their bodies. Many of these clinics not only offer a general health care provider, but also endocrinologists (who can give and monitor hormone therapies), psychologists or psychiatrists that can help people through the process of modifying bodies, and they may have a more reasonable sliding-scale costs system and consideration for those without health insurance. The section on “**LGBTQ+ Inclusive Clinics**” are those health facilities which promote LGBTQ health on their websites and frequently offer some trans* specific health care, but which are not necessary equipped to handle all or most of the possible processes of body modification. Realize that neither of these subsections is comprehensive, so please let Skye know if you know of other clinics that treat LGBTQ+ communities.

The “**Mental Health Resources**” section offers information about health care standards and advocacy for improving and changing those standards.

The “**Insurance and Health Policy**” section is important because too often the trans*, DSD, and intersex communities do not have enough information about HOW health insurance works, where health insurance is discriminatory, how to utilize health insurance to their benefit, and who is working on changing health policy and how. This section describes those things. WPATH is the World Professional Association for Transgender Health, an organization dedicated to creating better standards of care for trans* people. They create a document called the “Standards of Care for the Health of Transsexual, Transgender, and Gender Non-Conforming People” that is used by physicians as a standardized model of care for trans* people. Trans* people can and should read this document to have a better understanding of what to expect from physicians for trans* related health care, to be educated about current standards of health care, and to continually push for better standards of care.

Section 2: Transitioning Information, Support, and Resources

“**Financing Transition**” contains links that will help you plan for the expenses of transitioning-related care, understand how health insurance works (or does not work) with transition-related expenses, and where you can ask people to donate towards your transition-related expenses.

Note that for all body part prosthetics (breast forms, genital prosthetics, etc) or non-permanent modifiers (such as binders or gaffs), effort has been made to find cheap alternatives to store-bought items and these links are put at the top of the list for each section so they are most readily available. For example, there are links on how to make a packer from a sock, a binder from tights, a gaff from tights, and breast forms from a bouncy ball toy.

“**Breast Forms**” are materials that have been shaped into the form of breasts which people can place under clothing to present as having breasts. The links include how to make breast forms cheaply as well as places that breast forms can be purchased. “**Nipple Enhancers**” are items which can also be placed under clothing to give the appearance of larger or more prominent nipples, especially if the breast form lacks nipples.

“**Gaffs**” are any type of clothing that is used to keep a tuck in place. Tucking is the act of rearranging the scrotum and/or penis in a way that the crotch appears flat rather than containing a bulge. There are links to how to make a gaff as well as where to buy gaffs.

“**Prosthetic Vaginas & Vulvas**” include links to places that offer materials molded into a variety of vulva and vaginal shapes. Many of these prosthetics are specifically developed for trans* and cross-dressing community members and can be used for personal affirmation and/or sexual interactions.

“**Chest Binders**” are the upper-body version of gaffs. Binders are useful for those with apparent breast tissue who prefer to present as having a flat chest. The links include how to make binders cheaply as well as places that binders can be purchased.

“**STPs, Packers, and Prosthetic Penises**” includes information about Stand to Pee devices, soft prosthetic penises that can be used in pants to present with a less flat crotch, as well as prosthetic penises that can be used just for packing, standing to pee, and/or sexual interactions. The links include how to make some of these devices cheaply as well as places that they can be purchased.

“**Harnesses and Packing Underwear**” includes links to underwear that is able to hold an STP, packer, and/or prosthetic penis. There is a common problem with these items falling out of traditional underwear so people have created underwear to fit these needs.

“**Trans* Masculine/Male and Trans* Feminine/Female Swimwear**” includes some options for swimwear for trans* people.

“**Trans* Affirming Clothing Websites**” includes everything from non-binary clothing to gender-inclusive lingerie to adult toy shops that are trans* friendly.

In the “**Surgery**” section there is a list of well-known **U.S. Doctors** that perform transition-related surgeries possibly including but not limited to: facial feminization surgery, breast augmentation, facial hair removal, tracheal shave, voice feminization, labiaplasty, vaginoplasty, double mastectomy with chest contouring, “man sculpture”, hysterectomy, bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy, scrotoplasty, metoidoplasty, or phalloplasty.

“**Hormone Replacement Therapy**” includes general information about the results and process of hormone therapy, information about access to clean needles, as well as **Youth Transition Resources**.

Section 3: Disorders of Sexual Development (DSD) and Intersex Communities

“**General Information, Support, and Resources**” includes information and support for those with DSDs and Intersex people as well as information about advocacy groups. Note that the Intersex Society of North America (ISNA) stopped being an active website or organization in 2008, but the site remains open as an information resource. Instead, Accord Alliance is now the primary advocacy and education organization for those with disorders of sexual development and the intersex community.

The **following 13 sections** offer information about and support for individuals that identify with certain DSD diagnoses, intersex body forms, or non-binary body types.

Section 4: Sexual Health and Queer Safe Sex 101

“**General Info and Support**” has links to websites that give information about sexually transmitted infections, sexual health, and open communication about these topics.

Under “**Sexual Health and STI’s**” the “**Youth**” section gives links to websites that help educate young people about sexual health and safe sex, offer resources to have these discussions within families, and show where advocacy is taking place to reform youth sexual health education. The rest of this section is dedicated to information about specific sexually transmitted infections, support for those with these infections, and advocacy related to education about STIs. Note that with the “**Viral STI’s**” section the “**HIV and AIDS**” section is expansive includes information/support about: infection and drug information; southeastern Midwest (IN, IL, KY, OH) HIV and AIDS clinics; HIV positive support; centers, advocacy and involvement, news; education tools; trans* specific resources; resources for people of color; resources for native Spanish speakers; government organization and public support; and faith based support.

The “**Adult Sex Education and Body Positivity**” includes links to more professional sexual health education sites as well as sex and body positive tumblrs.

Within “**Indiana Sexual Assault, Rape, and Recourse**” the section for “**Indiana Crisis Centers and Resources**” includes information about local crisis centers, the laws concerning what constitutes the various forms of sexual misconduct and assault as well as Indiana programs to address these issues. It should be noted that Indiana law (<http://www.ai.org/legislative/ic/code/title35/ar42/ch4.html>) is very behind in its definition of rape, which it defines as “a person who knowingly or intentionally has sexual intercourse with a member of the opposite sex”. This suggests that rape cannot occur between people of the same sex and that the sexual binary of male and female are the only recognized forms of bodies – both of which are hugely inaccurate and demeaning to the trans*, DSD, and intersex populations. Hopefully, organizations like INCASA (Indiana Coalition Against Sexual Assault) and others can unite to change these archaic laws that do not reflect the diversity of interactions and bodies that exist.

“**National Resources and Support**” offers links to national efforts to end sexual assault and rape as well as trans* specific websites for survivors of sexual assault and rape.

The last section within “**Indiana Sexual Assault, Rape, and Recourse**” contains sexual assault report and recourse sites on **public universities in Indiana**. Note that these reporting systems are vital to the safety of our communities and always important to have on campuses. It should also be recognized that these websites do not always have inclusive imagery or wording. There are always efforts being made to correct these problems, but *please realize that if you experience sexual violence, assault, and/or are raped, it is important get to a safe place, GET SUPPORT, and report the crime.*

Section 5: Supportive Resources

The “**Supportive Resources**” section offers links to websites that are not dedicated to medical information, but instead are for community-based support. “**Trans* Resources**” contains websites that are geared towards the trans* community as a whole. **MTF** and **FTM** sections contain resources for those who identify as a male or female bodied person who identified as a female or male bodied person, respectively. “**Genderqueer and Non-binary**” resources are for all those who identify between of outside the binary male/female system.

The section for “**Trans* People of Color**” has links for people of color who identify within the trans* umbrella. “**Youth Resources**” are divided into sections about “**Youth Support and Identity Formation**”, support and resources for **Families** with trans* children or children for trans* parents, etc., information about “**Schools, Anti-Bullying, and Suicide Prevention**” which includes resources for homeless youth and others. The information about **homelessness** and resources for homeless people is NOT limited to youth. It was placed in this section because homeless youth is such a huge problem within the LGBQ and especially T* communities. However, many of the *resources about homelessness are general and applicable to many people*. There are also supportive resources for many identities that intersect with trans* identities, including: **elders, living with a disability, service members and veterans, faith-based community support, addiction treatment and recovery communities**, and **allies** of the trans* community.

Lastly, there is information for **Safer Restrooms, Safe Housing**, and **Resources specific to the Southeastern Midwest** which includes Indiana, Illinois, Kentucky, and Ohio.

Section 6: Centers and Community Resource Consolidation Initiatives

This section is broken down between community/public resources and university resources. Within “**University Resources**” there is information about inclusive offices, centers, and campus climate resources for Universities throughout the U.S. Within “**Community Resource Centers**” there are links to the websites of “**Community Centers**”, which are physical safe spaces and community support centers. There are also links to “**Community Resource Initiatives**” which are community organized LGBTQ+ supportive organizations that do not have a physical space.

Section 7: Trans* in the Workplace & Other Legal Information

This section is the most actively being updated. The first section, “**Workplace Protections and Advocacy**” give websites of organizations dedicated to promoting trans* equality in professional environments. Many can also give you access to information about your rights. The next section, “**Finding Trans* Friendly Employers**” lists websites that can help you search for trans* friendly work places in your area.

Section 8: Legal Reform and Public Activism

This section contains Trans* related “**News**”, links to the websites of advocates for **reform of laws** that affect trans* and intersex communities, and those diagnosed with DSDs, and information about groups that are involved in “**Activism and Community Organizing**”.

University Resources > **How to change your visible name on outgoing emails in the MyMail Purdue University System without a legal name change**

- Go to: mymail.purdue.edu
- Login with your Purdue email address and your password.
- There will be a row of tabs at the top labeled “Mail”, “Address Book”, “Calendar”, “Tasks”, “Documents”, “Briefcase”, and “Preferences”.
 - Click on “Preferences”.
- Notice that the left panel in the mail system will change.
 - When the “Mail” tab is highlighted (which is the default), there will be inbox folders, sent mail, and trash to click on.
 - Instead, there will now be a series of topics to click on
 - Notice here that the “Mail” option on this left panel will be opened and other options are available underneath it.
- Under the “Mail” option on the left panel, click on “Accounts” and this will change the center panel
- Within the “Accounts” center panel, there are two headings: “Accounts” and “Primary Account Settings”
 - Focus on the “Primary Account Settings”
- There will be a line of text that says “Messages sent from this account have the following settings:”
 - The first box under this text will be “Choose the name that appears in the ‘From’ field of email messages”
 - This box is a way for you to type in your preferred name!
 - Type in your full preferred name (First , Middle initial, and Last)
- Once typed in, it will automatically save
- Send yourself an email to make sure it worked and now your preferred name will appear in all your outgoing email – Congrats! :D

University Resources > **How to change your visible email address and your searchable name in the Purdue University System**

- Go to itap.purdue.edu
- On the far right is a vertical panel labeled “Popular Destinations”
 - Click on “Change your password”
- Login when prompted
- Notice at the top of this new screen (in very tiny font) there are words to denote the path to arrive at this screen
 - This list of words will say “ITaP Home > IAMO Home > Account Information > Password Change”
 - Click on “Account Information”
- On the User Account Information page that comes up, there will be several gray-highlighted headers
 - Find the one on the right side labeled “Your @purdue.edu E-mail”
 - Click on “Purdue Directory” below this header
- Rather than search the Purdue Directory, notice the three buttons below the search box
 - Click on the middle one: “Update Your Directory Listing”
- Login again when prompted
- Now you are at a page that shows your full directory listing!
- Anything labeled as “University Records” on the right column cannot be changed
- Anything labeled as “Change...” on the right column CAN be changed
 - Notice that this includes “Change email” and “Change Nickname”
- Changing your email has obvious consequences – the email you use to interact with people through the Purdue System will be changed
- Changing your nickname in the system allows people to look you up by your preferred name as well as your legal name
 - For example: if you go by Tayler Freeman but your legal name is Ashley Freeman, people can typically ONLY look you up in the system by searching “Ashley Freeman”.
 - If someone searches “Tayler Freeman” nothing will come up unless someone else’s legal name or preferred name is in the system with that name.
 - This means for people to find someone in the system, they may have to out themselves via their legal name to be found in the directory.
 - By changing your nickname, although people will still see your legal name, it makes it a lot less awkward for people to look you up by your preferred name (potentially).
